2025 Seedling Descriptions

Fraser Fir: Grows 40 to 60 feet in height with a spread of 20 to 25 feet. Very soft, shiny, dark green foliage is silver on the underside. Likes cool, moist, well drained soil. Will not do well in heavy, wet, clay soil. Does not require full sun.

Black Spruce: Grows to 30-50 feet high/ 8-12 feet. spread. Slow growth rate (12" or less per year) . shorter needles and smaller and rounder cones than the other spruces, and a preference for wetter lowland areas. Full sun to shade.

Balsam Fir: North American native fir growing to a height of 50 to 75 feet. Spread 25 to 30 feet. Needles are soft, bluish-green in color with a silver flash on the underside. Plant in sandy, loamy or heavy clay soil. Prefers well drained acidic, moist soil.

Swamp Chestnut Oak: Height and spread to 60 feet. Can tolerate poor, dry, rocky soil. Can grow to 15 feet in 7 to 10 years. Acorns are rich dark brown with a very sweet taste. Relished by squirrels, deer and other wildlife.

Sugar Maple: Height 60 to 75 feet. Spread 45 to 50 feet. Mature trees provide sugar products from sap in the spring. Brilliant yellow, burnt orange and limited red tones in autumn. A good timber tree. Does not do well in wet areas or in small compact restricted growing areas.

Chinese Chestnut: Growth to 20 to 25 feet. Turns yellow to bronze in fall. Grows best in full sun; deep, sandy loam. These dense and round headed ornamental trees bear large, sweet, delicious edible nuts. Although, self fertile, it is best to plant two or more for best pollination and nut production. Should start bearing nuts in 3 to 5 years.

White Dogwood: Grows to 40 feet. Covered in beautiful white flower in early spring. Dense lustrous, green foliage turning crimson in the fall. Produces bright red berried are food for birds. Does best in rich, moist soil, but is known to grow well in average well drained soil. The White Flowering Dogwood is considered to be the best ornamental of all trees.

Red Osier Dogwood: A deciduous shrub, 6 feet to 10 feet tall with an equal or greater spread, shape is rounded and spreading loose and somewhat open, multi-stemmed. Tolerant of dry sites, but prefers wet areas along streams and ponds. Leaves and trunk turns turn dark red in the fall.

Black Choke Berry: Very ornamental due to its flowery blossoms and colorful fruit. Grows to 8 feet tall with a 3-4 feet spread. Commonly grows in wet areas, but can tolerate dry soils.

Blueberries: One Earliblue plant and one Duke plant, planted together to increase the size and quantity of the harvest. Earliblue is one of the first blueberries of the season. Self-pollinating, ripen in June producing a large sweet berry. Duke is an early season, large, firm berry with good color.

Red Raspberries: Heritage, everbearing - All-time favorite. Excellent fruit, good flavor, sweet taste and high yielding .

Purple Raspberries: Brandywine. very large, purple, tart fruit - great for jams, jellies, pies. Has excellent flavor.

Northeast Annual & Perennial Wildflower Mix: Majority of this mix reaches 2-5 feet at maturity. This colorful mix will provide up to five years of color, and attracts a variety of birds and butterflies.

Butterfly and Hummingbird Garden Mix: Majority of this mix reaches 3-4 feet at maturity. This of native and naturalized wildflowers and grasses in designed to attract nectar– loving pollinators such as native bees, insects, and humming birds.
